




13 March – Dead of Winter (15)

Hit by a blizzard, a grief-stricken loner (Emma Thompson) gets lost among backroads near a Minnesotan lake and stops for help at a remote cabin in the woods. Here she discovers a young woman (Laurel Marsden) kidnapped by a desperate couple (Judy Greer, Marc Menchaca) who are armed and intent on murder. Isolated and without cell service, this unlikely hero realizes she is the woman's only hope of survival.




13 February – A Complete Unknown (15)

Scottish setting, true life story of John Davidson. Diagnosed with Tourette's at 15, targeted as 'insane' by his peers, he struggled with a condition few had witnessed. Campaigning for better understanding and acceptance of the condition as an adult, he finds his life's purpose and accepted his MBE from the Queen in 2019.

Rona, fresh out of rehab, returns to the wild Orkney Islands after more than a decade away. As she reconnects with the dramatic landscape where she grew up, memories of her childhood merge with the more recent challenging events that have set her on the path to recovery.

Prabha, a nurse from Mumbai, is thrown into confusion when her estranged husband suddenly reaches out to her. But beneath the façade of their supposed ideal life, a storm is brewing – as Theo's career nosedives while Ivy's own ambitions take off, a tinderbox of fierce competition and hidden resentment ignites.

9 October – La Reine Margot (18) French

In 1572 a religious war is raging in France. In order to impose peace, a forced royal wedding must take place between the King's sister and Henri of Navarre. Behind this guise of harmony Catherine of Medici is seen to maintain the power, ordering poisonings and assaults.



13 November – Small Things Like These (12A)

Over Christmas 1985 devoted father and coal merchant Bill Furlong (Cillian Murphy) discovers startling secrets kept by the convent in his town, along with some shocking truths of his own. The film reveals truths about Ireland's Magdalene laundries -- horrific asylums run by Roman Catholic institutions from the 1820s until 1996, ostensibly to reform "fallen young women".
