



12 January - The Great Escaper (12A)

2023 **1hr 36mins**

The *Great Escaper* sees two-time Oscar winners Sir Michael Caine and the late Glenda Jackson reuniting to portray the real-life story of Bernard Jordan who in 2014 escaped from his care home in Hove, East Sussex, to attend the 70th anniversary commemoration of the D-Day Landings in France. Writer William Ivory wants the audience to feel they've been on an emotional journey when they leave the cinema

9 February - The 8 Mountains (12) **Italian**
2022 **2hr 27mins**

An epic journey of friendship and self-discovery set in the Italian Alps. *The Eight Mountains* is as intimate as it is monumental. Through observant detail and stunning landscape photography, we see the profound relationship between Pietro and Bruno who first meet as children in an Alpine village. Years later, the estranged friends reunite, after the passing of Pietro's father, to realize his dream of rebuilding a ruined cabin on a mountain slope.



8 March - Promising Young Woman (15)
2020 **1hr 48mins**

Emerald Fennell's BAFTA-winning debut feature packs in style, wit and sharp social commentary, with a propulsive performance from Carey Mulligan at its centre. Everyone said Cassie was a promising young woman... until a mysterious event abruptly derailed her future. But nothing in Cassie's life is what it appears to be: she's wickedly smart, tantalizingly cunning, and she's living a secret double life by night.



12 April - The Old Oak (15)
2023 **1hr 30mins**

Rumoured to be the final film of acclaimed British director, Ken Loach. *The Old Oak* is a moving and powerful drama that shows the way fear and hope can define and drive a community. A pub landlord in a previously thriving mining community struggles to hold onto his pub. Meanwhile, tensions rise in the town when Syrian refugees are placed in the empty houses in the community.



10 May - Tár (15)
2022 **2hr 38mins**

Set in the world of classical music, the film centres on Lydia Tár, widely considered one of the greatest living composers/conductors and first-ever female chief conductor of a major German orchestra. As the maestro heading into crisis, Cate Blanchett's performance pierces like a conductor's baton through the heart.



14 June - Barbie (12A)

2023 **1hr 54mins**

Barbie and Ken are having the time of their lives in the colourful and seemingly perfect world of Barbie Land. However, when they get a chance to go to the real world, they soon discover the joys and perils of living among humans. Greta Gerwig's smash hit ode to women delves deeper than many would have expected from a film based on a problematic doll

2022 **2hr 8mins**

Carey Mulligan and Zoe Kazan star as a pair of New York Times journalists, who together broke one of the most important stories in a generation. Discovering a trail of sexual assaults they work on a story about the film producer, Harvey Weinstein -- which helped launch the MeToo movement.



11 October - Past Lives (12) **Korean & English**
2023 **1hr 46mins**

After decades apart, a South Korean woman living in New York reconnects online with the man who was once her closest childhood friend. They are reunited for one fateful week as they confront destiny, love and the choices that make a life.

A wistful drama of longing and human connection.

13 December - Lunana: a Yak in the Classroom (PG)

2019 **English/Dzongkha** **1hr 50mins**
This charming, quietly funny culture-clash film, about a young teacher in Bhutan who is posted to a remote mountain village, is a thoughtful exploration of happiness and community values. Its likeability and humour – and almost childlike faith in the power of singing to overcome melancholy and adversity – means you'll find yourself smiling along. In 2019 it became the first Bhutanese film to get an Oscar nomination for best international feature..

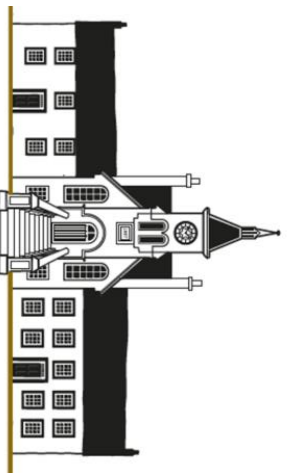
